E-Language Firm Founder Honored by Toyota Dealers in D.C.

Yogini Dahiwadkar, founder and chief executive officer of Quick-n-EZ Language, a Columbia, Md.-based provider of educational and e-language products, has been named by a Toyota dealers' association in the Washington, D.C. area as one of seven "Toyota Tribute to Working Women" honorees.

Quick-n-EZ Language is a language teaching method originally created by Dahiwadkar to teach her preschoolers Hindi and Marathi.

Formerly named IndiToy, the products were introduced in 2009 and the company was renamed Quick-n-EZ to indicate a broader market focus.

The products, marketed by IndiToy, Inc., currently have a local presence in 14 states and Canada.

The award is given to women in the Washington, D.C. metro area who have made a difference in their workplace, community or home.

Dahiwadkar was presented her award at the "Toyota Tribute to

Working Women" event hosted by the local ABC news affiliate, WJLA-TV, Oct. 19 at the National Press Club in Washington.

"I am very proud and honored to be named one of the seven honorees of this award," said Dahiwadkar. "I have always strived to make an impact in every aspect from work to home life and in the community and I am very grateful to be recognized for my efforts."
